What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Foundation Series Global ESG Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. FundRock NZ Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

Objective: The Fund's objective is to perform broadly in line with the return of its investment benchmark before fees and tax over the long-term.

Strategy: The Fund aims for high long-run returns by investing in ETFs that invests in shares of large, mid-sized and small companies listed on international stock markets.

The Fund incorporates certain responsible investment considerations and is exposed to investment strategies that seek to limit exposure to companies involved in specific business practices.

The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

The charges outlined above represent the fees charged within the ETFs (external management fees) and have been estimated based on information in the ETFs' disclosure documents. Note that the fees within the ETFs are not tax deductible. Investors are charged each time they buy (entry fee) or sell (exit fee) units in the fund. These fees are charged to cover the costs of the underlying brokerage, foreign currency exchange, transaction fees and investment management service fees associated with investing in the underlying investments. Current entry and exit fees are 0.50%.



Investors may also be charged individual action fees for specific actions or decisions (for example, for withdrawing from or switching funds). 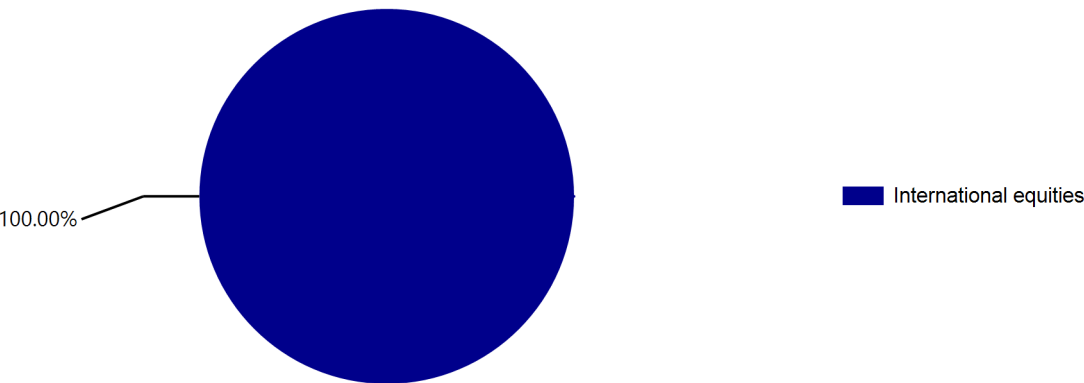
Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

Anthony had \$10,000 in the fund when the fund received its first contribution, 04 March 2025 and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the period to 30 September 2025, Anthony received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$1,365 (that is 13.65% of his initial \$10,000). This gives Anthony a return after tax of \$1,275 for the period.

What does the fund invest in?

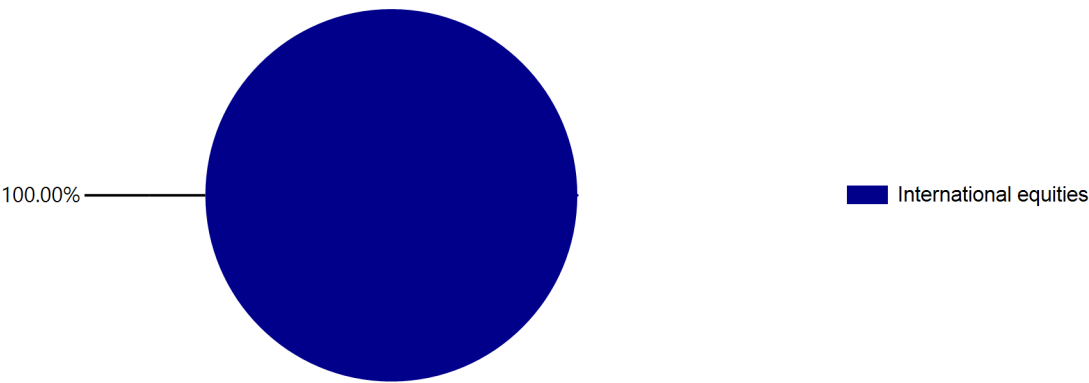
This shows the types of assets that the fund invests in.

Notes

1. A combination of actual fund returns and market index returns have been used to determine the risk indicator as the fund has not been operating for the required five years. The risk indicator may therefore provide a less reliable indicator of the fund's future volatility.
2. As the fund has not completed a full scheme year as at 31 March 2025, historical fee information is not available.
3. As the fund has not existed for a full year, figures in this example are based on returns from the date of the inception date.
