What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Coolabah Short Term Income PIE Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Description of this fund

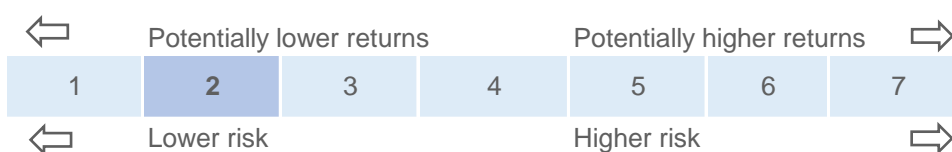
Objective: The fund targets investment returns, after fees and before tax, of 1.5% to 3.0% per annum above the overnight interbank cash rate as published by the Reserve Bank of New Zealand, over a rolling 12 month period.

Strategy: The fund provides exposure to an actively managed, diversified portfolio that aims to take advantage of investment opportunities within the Australian cash and fixed income markets.

What are the risks of investing?¹

Risk indicator for the Coolabah Short Term Income PIE Fund.



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

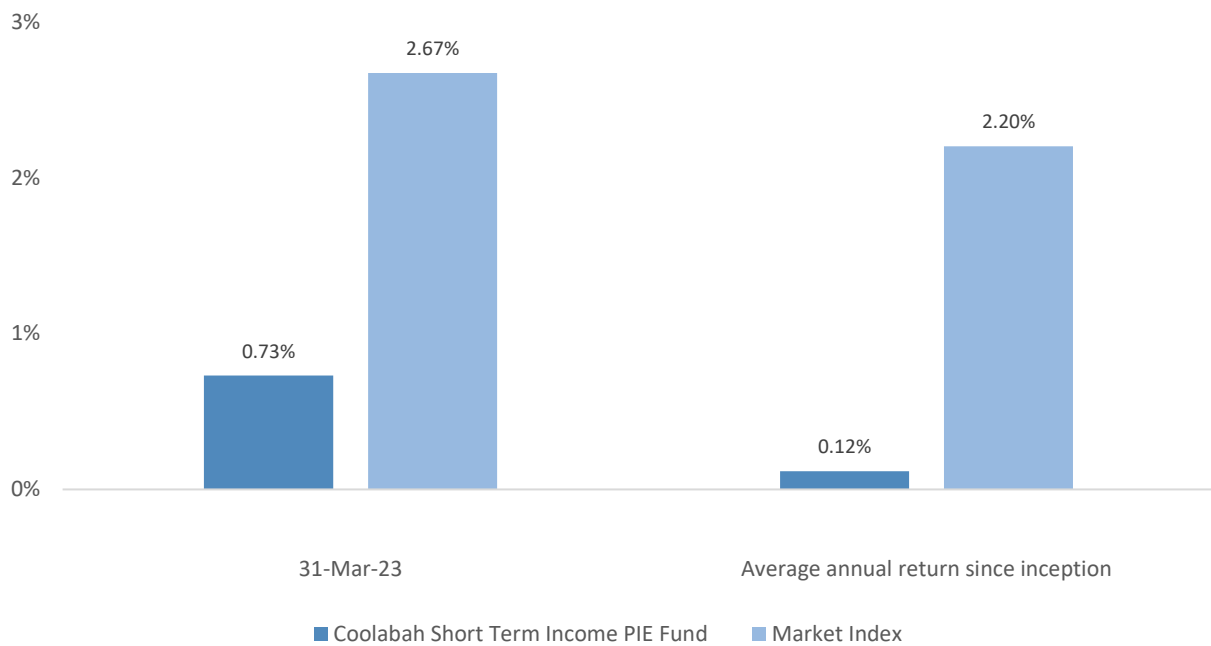

How has the fund performed?

Example of how this applies to an investor

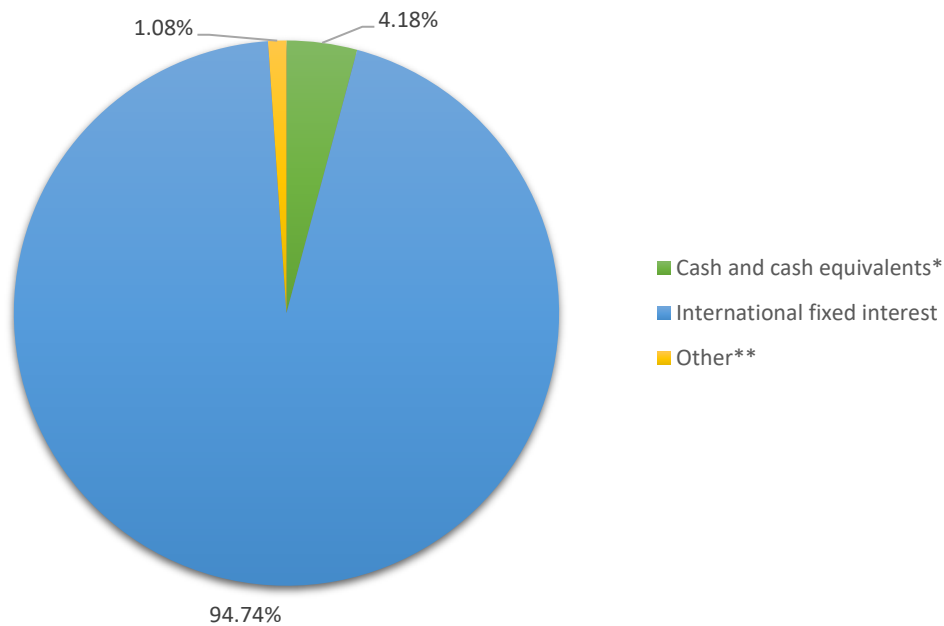
Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

Anthony had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Anthony received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$239 (that is 2.39% of his initial \$10,000). This gives Anthony a total return after tax of \$73 for the year.

This shows the types of assets that the fund invests in.

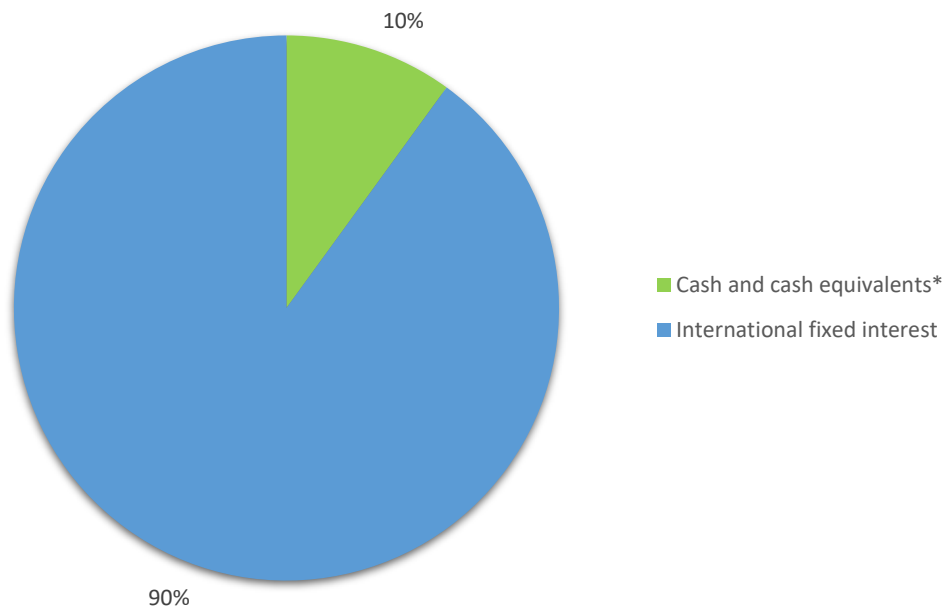
Actual investment mix

Notes

- 1 The Funds invest in other funds ("underlying funds") which each have an established return history. A combination of actual fund returns and underlying fund returns have been used to determine the risk indicator as the fund has not been operating for the required five years. Underlying fund returns have been used until 31 December 2021 and fund returns thereafter. The risk indicator may therefore provide a less reliable indicator of the fund's future volatility.
- 2 The bar chart shows fund returns after deducting fees and tax. Tax is deducted at the highest Prescribed Investor Rate of 28%. However, the market index returns are shown before deducting fees and tax. Your tax may be lower.
- 3 As the fund only started accepting contributions on 09 December 2021, and audited accounts for the first full financial year to 31 March 2023 are not yet available, historical fee information is not available.
