What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the ACI Balanced Strategy has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Description of this fund

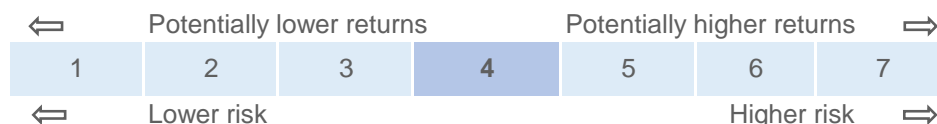
Objective: The strategy aims to achieve a rate of return (net of fees but before tax) of at least 3.125% per annum above inflation (as measured by Statistics New Zealand's Consumer Price Index) over rolling five-year periods.

Strategy: Blend of the ACI Conservative Fund and ACI Growth Fund. It invests mainly in growth assets but includes some income assets.

What are the risks of investing?ⁱ

Risk indicator for the ACI Balanced Strategy.



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

Example of how this applies to an investorⁱⁱⁱ

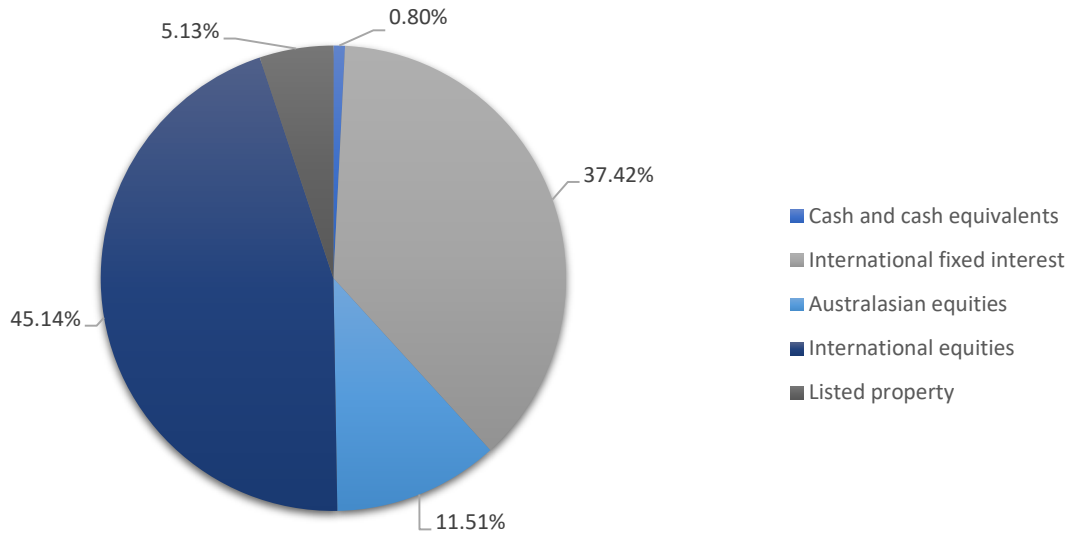
Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

Anthony had \$10,000 in the fund when the fund received its first contribution, 04 April 2023 and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the period to 30 June 2023, Anthony received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$303 (that is 3.03% of his initial \$10,000). This gives Anthony a total return after tax of \$295 for the period.

What does the fund invest in?

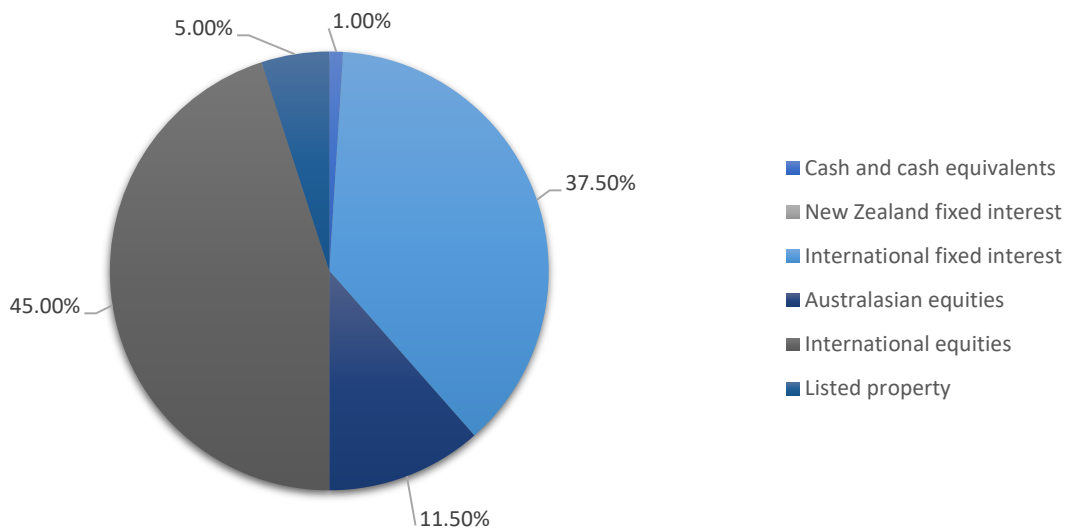
This shows the types of assets that the fund invests in.

It aims to hedge 100% of foreign currency exposures in the underlying international fixed-interest assets, 100% of property exposure and 50% of the underlying international equity assets. Currency exposure in Australian equities and Emerging Markets equities is unhedged. The overall target hedging ratio of the portfolio is 61%.

Notes

- i A combination of actual returns and market index returns have been used to determine the risk indicator as the strategy has not been operating for the required five years. - ii As the strategy only started accepting contributions on 4 April 2023, historical fee information is not available.
