What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Stewart Investors Worldwide Leaders Sustainability Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. FundRock NZ Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

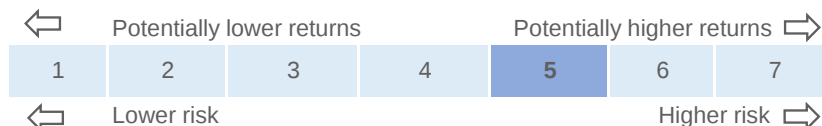
Objective: To achieve long-term capital growth by investing directly or indirectly in a diversified portfolio of equity or equity-related securities of larger capitalisation companies which are listed, traded or dealt in on any of the regulated markets worldwide. The fund aims to exceed the MSCI All Country World Index (NZD) over rolling five-year periods before fees and taxes.

Strategy: The fund invests in companies which are positioned to contribute to, and benefit from sustainable development. Larger capitalisation companies are currently defined for the purposes of this fund as companies with a minimum investible market cap (free float) of US\$5 billion at the time of investment. The Investment Manager may revise this definition as considered appropriate. The fund may have exposure to developed markets or emerging markets whilst maintaining its geographical diversity.

What are the risks of investing?¹

Example of how this applies to an investor

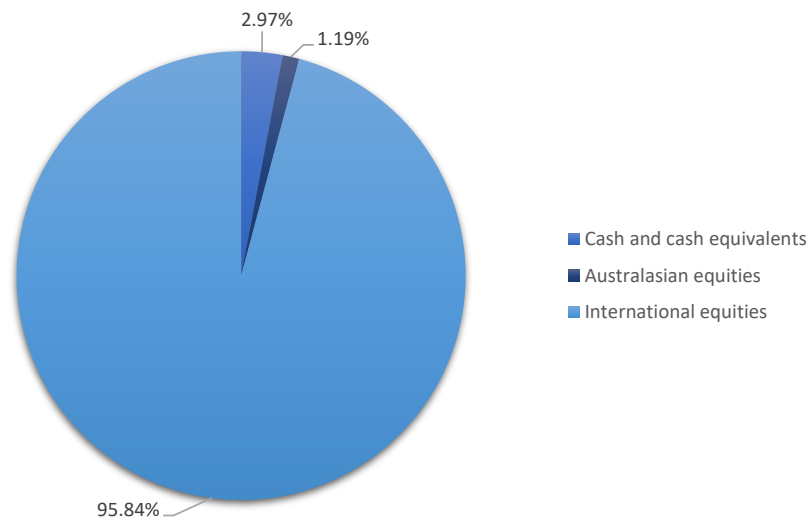
Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

Anthony had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Anthony received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$2,071 (that is 20.71% of his initial \$10,000). This gives Anthony a total return after tax of \$1,940 for the year.

What does the fund invest in?

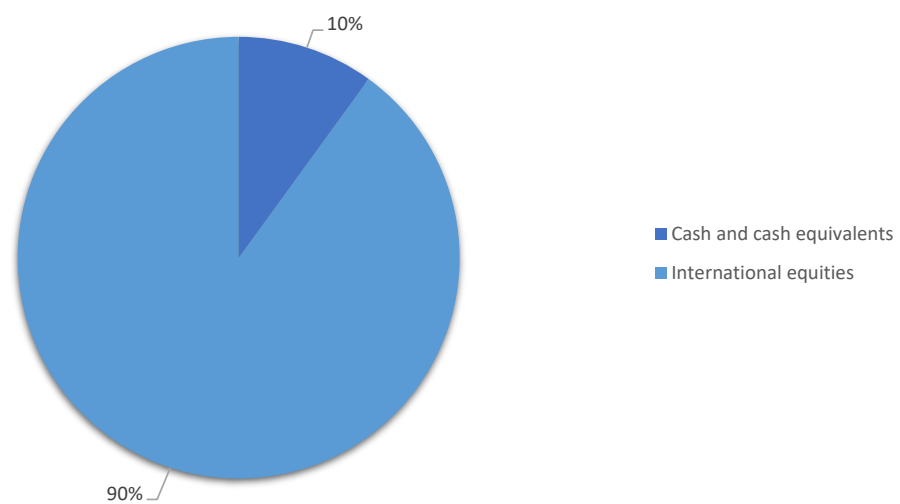
This shows the types of assets that the fund invests in.

Notes

¹ A combination of actual fund returns, and market index returns have been used to determine the risk indicator as the fund has not been operating for the required five years.
