What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Hyperion Global Growth Companies PIE Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Description of this fund

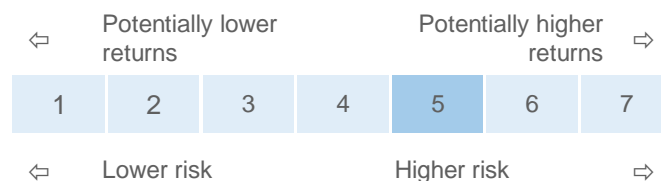
Objective: Achieve long-term returns above the MSCI World Net Total Return Index in NZ dollars, and minimise the risk of permanent capital loss.

Strategy: The Fund invests in growth-oriented companies primarily listed on a recognised global exchange, at the time of investment. Typically, the Fund is highly concentrated with 15-30 stocks that in Hyperion's view that are high-quality business franchises with sustainable competitive advantages, have above average long-term growth potential, have low levels of gearing, and have predictable long-term earnings streams.

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the Hyperion Global Growth Companies PIE Fund¹.

Example of how this applies to an investor³

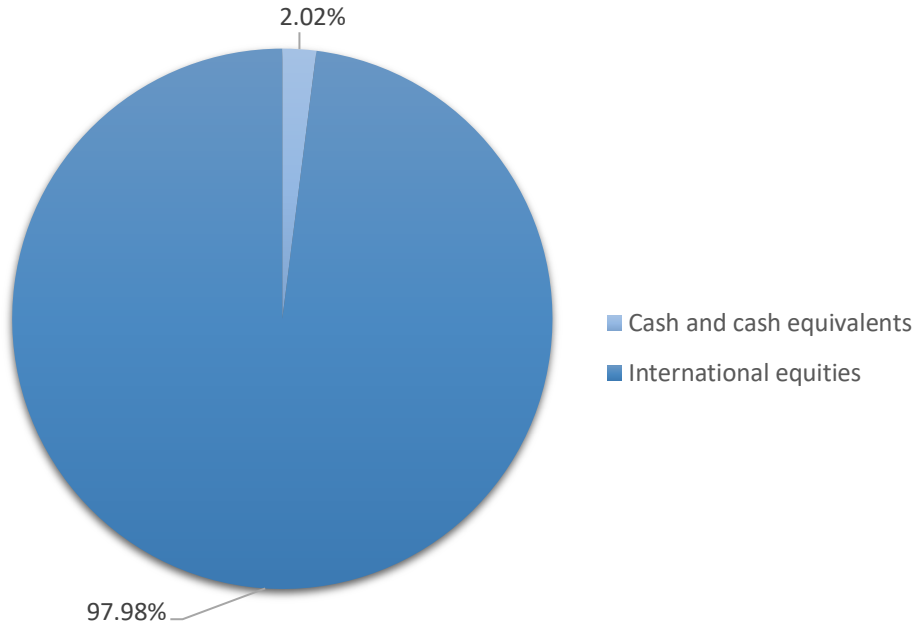
Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

Anthony had \$10,000 in the fund when the fund received its first contribution, on 03 March 2022, and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the period to 30 June 2022 Anthony incurred a loss after fund charges were deducted of \$1,003 (that is -10.03% of his initial \$10,000). This gives Anthony a total loss after tax of \$1,009 for the period.

What does the fund invest in?

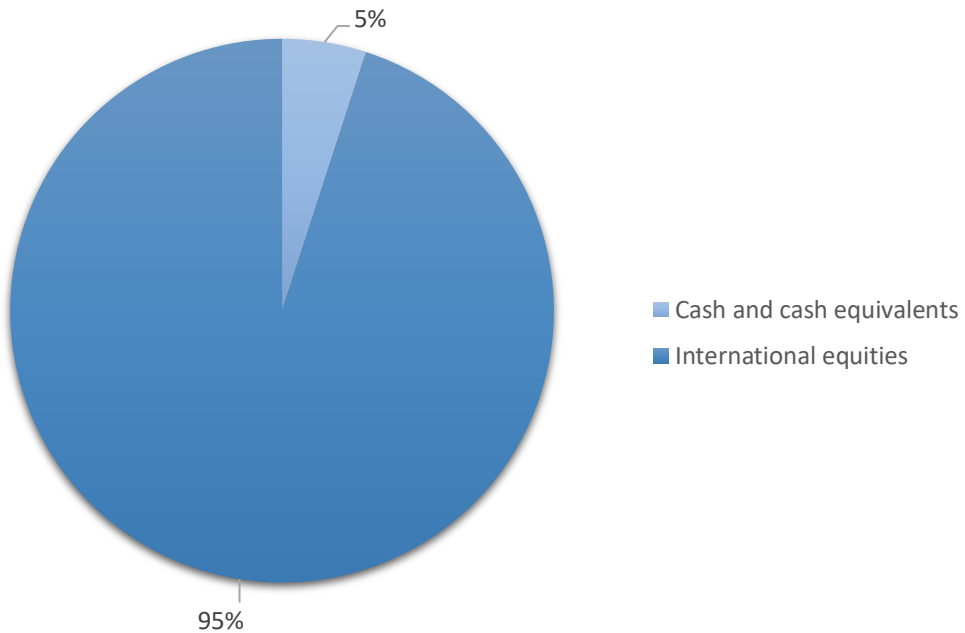
This shows the types of assets that the fund invests in.

Notes

¹ A combination of actual fund returns and market index returns have been used to determine the risk indicator as the fund has not been operating for the required five years. The risk indicator may therefore provide a less reliable indicator of the fund's future volatility. Market index returns have been used until March 2022 and fund returns thereafter.

² As the fund only started accepting contributions on 03 March 2022, historical fee information is not available.
